a school, we seek to create an environment where scholars can holistically grow and develop. The addition of this partnership has been such a valuable asset to our program.




STAR STOMP

On Saturday night, December 17th the FHJ scholars put on a performance to remember. They shared the story of the coming of the Savior from the perspective of a host of stars.


















Bible Expo: The Living Word

The scholars might have been even more excited as they eagerly looked forward to presenting in the magnificently decorated gymnasium. The Bible Expo, the brainchild of our second-grade teacher Shelley Pelote, is always incredible, but this one would be the first Bible Wax Museum, and everyone involved was thrilled.

As the guests walked into the gym, the décor immediately caught their attention. A life-sized Holy Bible took center stage. John 1:1 was etched on its pages reminding everyone of the meaning behind the theme: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God. And the Word
